#### Core Funding Quality Action Plan Report 2023/2024

Core Funding requires all early learning and care, school-age childcare and childminding services that benefit from Core Funding to complete a Quality Action Plan and to report on same. The reporting procedure mirrors that of the Quality Action Plan itself, i.e. services are required to complete an online survey that generates a PDF document.

Having submitted your response please remember to **PRINT** and **SAVE** your Quality Action Plan Report as a PDF before closing out of the survey.

You then need to upload your Core Funding Quality Action Plan Report (PDF document) to the 'My Service Profile' on the HIVE system for validation.



#### **Core Funding Reporting Requirement Year 1**

The Core Funding Reporting Requirement for year 1 consists of an Income and Expenditure report. The completed report will be submitted on a new portal which will open in two stages.

**Stage 1** – Providers should have received an email from <a href="mailto:support@cfcrrs.ie">support@cfcrrs.ie</a>. If you haven't and after checking your junk mail, contact Karen on **Mobile**: 0874705806 | Email: <a href="mailto:karen@fingalcountychildcare.ie">karen@fingalcountychildcare.ie</a>

The email will contain a link that will take you directly to the registration portal where you will register and link your accountant. This registration is to facilitate the submission of the completed Income and Expenditure Template by your Accountant.

**Stage 2**- The portal will be open on or before the 31st of May to accept completed Income and Expenditure report templates.

**26th June 2024** is the Income and Expenditure report submission deadline.

Notice for services located in schools re closure day due to Local and European elections on 7<sup>th</sup> June.

Early Learning and Care/School Age Childcare Providers located within a school premises or on the school grounds, and where the school is used as a polling station for elections/referendums on a day which the ELC/SAC service is scheduled to be open are not required:

- to amend their calendars or
- apply for force majeure.

Affected services providing the ECCE programme are not required to make up that day for the purposes of meeting the 182-day rule in the programme year.



#### **Equal Start**

Equal Start is a funding model and a set of associated universal and targeted measures to support access and participation in early learning and care (ELC) and school-age childcare (SAC) for children and their families who experience disadvantage.

It is the fourth element of Together for Better, the funding model for ELC and SAC, which currently comprises the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) programme, including the Access and Inclusion Model (AIM), the National Childcare Scheme (NCS) and Core Funding.

All services are encouraged to complete the survey; however, it is mandatory for all existing Core Funding Partner Services.

Fraudulent Early Years Training courses

The DCEDIY advise all early year's services of fraudulent advertising currently circulating on social media using Government of Ireland and Department of Education logos, offering free early learning and childcare training courses and free study aids such as laptops. These advertisements are not from the Department. These adverts should not be confused with the Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF).

#### Pilot Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF)

The new Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF) pilot is open for Early Years Educators to make applications for the academic year 2024/2025. Those wishing to make an application must be working with children in a Tusla registered ELC/SAC service for the last 6 months (before their application). The service must also have a current Core funding contract with the DCEDIY.

From 1<sup>st</sup> May 2024, applicants with a current application/offer for 2024/25 entry to a Level 7/8 degree course approved by the Qualification Advisory Board (QAB) eligible for NSLF should email Pobal, at <a href="MSLF@pobal.ie">MSLF@pobal.ie</a> to request a link to the Nurturing Skills Learner Fund Student Portal. #### AIM Level 4,5 & 7 Go Live Dates

#### Temporary arrangements for students to work in settings during the summer period.

In light of the current staffing pressures in early learning and care (ELC) and school-age childcare (SAC) services, as a temporary measure specifically to help services with short-term staffing shortages over the summer period, the DCEDIY has arranged an accelerated process for assessment of equivalence with the level 5 minimum qualification requirement for students currently enrolled on a recognized level 6, 7 or 8 course. 
#### **Vacancy Survey**

- 1. Do you currently have any vacant places and in which age categories. (A vacant place means availability five days per week)
- 2. Are you currently operating at your Tusla registered capacity, and do you expect this to change by September 2024 and if so, why?

We would be grateful if you could take the time to complete the survey, even if you are operating at full capacity and have no vacancies, we would appreciate you making a return as we have been asked to get a response from 100% of our service providers. # Critical Incidents in Early Learning and Care and School Age Childcare Services: Planning and Responding

All Early Learning and Care (ELC) and school Age Childcare (SAC) services are required to have a service level Critical Incident Plan as outlined in the Tusla Quality and Regulatory Framework (QRF) and the National Quality Guidelines for School Age Childcare Services. 



#### **FCCC Jobs Board**

Fingal CCC have updated their website to include an interactive Jobs Board. This Jobs Board will support early childcare providers to advertise their recruitment needs and to provide parents the opportunity to advertise needs with the aim of linking, early years, childminders, and parents in the Fingal area. The new FCCC Jobs Board facilitates the recruitment of staff into the ELC Sector in Fingal. To advertise a job simply go to our website and click on the jobs board tab. Employers with job vacancies can post a job by clicking on the link above and fill in the required fields. The jobs posted will go live immediately and will be visible on the site for 30 days and will then be archived. **Note - you don't need to set up a log in, just complete the form and click submit.** 

#### **Service Closures**

We have been asked what the process is for services, if for whatever reason, you have decided not to reopen or closed within the current programme year. The steps are as follows:

- Inform FCCC via email to info@fingalcountychildcare.ie
- Complete the Cessation of Services form for Tusla click on the link below. http://www.tusla.ie/uploads/content/Cessation\_of\_Service.pdf
- Inform Pobal & make any necessary changes to registrations on the HIVE. Service Closure If an Approved Provider closes its ELC service, or ceases to provide a DCEDIY childcare programme, notice must be submitted in writing immediately to the local City/County Childcare Committee and the Data Management Team in the Scheme Administrator by raising a service request on the EY HIVE and selecting the Request Programme Type "User Account Management", then selecting the Category "How to" and the Sub-Category "Closures. FCCC will link in with individual services once the notification has been received.
