Update: Programme Readiness 2024/25

Programme readiness for ECCE, AIM Level 1, NCS and CCSP will be available on the Hive in the coming weeks, along with Core Funding applications and funding agreements.

This is later than in previous years and we apologise for any inconvenience caused. The delay is due to new system enhancements currently being developed which are taking longer than anticipated but we are working hard to-wards opening programme readiness during the week of 24 June.

New Employment Regulation Orders for the Early Years Services Sector

The Orders include the removal of the requirement for graduates to have three years' experience before they are eligible for Graduate Lead Educator/Graduate Manager rates of pay to widen access to graduate premiums under Core Funding.

From 24 June, Core Funding partner services will have the opportunity to attract a Graduate Lead Educator/Manager premium for staff who meet the following criteria:

Graduate Lead Educator for ELC sessions

- Must be assigned to the role of Lead Educator in an ELC session(s) and be reflected as such in the Core Funding application.
- Must hold an eligible qualification per the Department's list of approved qualifications, Level 7 or above.
- Each ELC session can only have one Lead Educator at any one time
- Graduate Manager Premium
- Must be a Graduate Manager working in an ELC service.
- Must hold an eligible qualification per the Department's list of approved qualifications, Level 7 or above.
- An individual cannot be in receipt of both a Graduate Manager Premium and a Graduate Lead Educator Premium.
- SAC-only services and/or childminders are not eligible for the Graduate Manager Premium.
- What am I required to do in advance?
- The information for graduate staff members must be accurate and up to date on the service profile.
- What am I required to do when the EROs come into effect on 24 June 2024?

• Partner services with an eligible staff member must submit an application change no earlier than 24 June 2024 with a change effective date of 24 June 2024.

• An application change is required if a partner service is adding a staff member to their Core Funding application module for the first time.

• An application change is required if a partner service has a staff member in their existing Core Funding application module who now qualifies for the Graduate Lead Educator/Manager premiums.

Any increase in the Graduate Lead Educator/Manager premiums will be effective from the application change submission date or the change effective date, whichever is later. Partner services have until 30 June 2024 to submit an application change with a change effective date of 24 June 2024.

Temporary arrangements for students to work in settings during the summer period.

In light of the current staffing pressures in early learning and care (ELC) and school-age childcare (SAC) services, as a temporary measure specifically to help services with short-term staffing shortages over the summer period, the DCEDIY has arranged an accelerated process for assessment of equivalence with the level 5 minimum qualification requirement for students currently enrolled on a recognized level 6, 7 or 8 course. Critical Incidents in Early Learning and Care and School Age Childcare Services: Planning and Responding

All Early Learning and Care (ELC) and school Age Childcare (SAC) services are required to have a service level Critical Incident Plan as outlined in the Tusla Quality and Regulatory Framework (QRF) and the National Quality Guidelines for School Age Childcare Services. A guide has been developed from previous guidance on critical incidents plan ning, including the Critical Incident Plan Toolkit and the extensive work of the National Educational Psychological Service (NEPS), to support ELC and SAC services to think about and plan for critical incidents and to have practical supports in place should it be necessary to respond to a critical incident. <u>https://www.tusla.ie/uploads/content/Critical_Inci-</u> dent_Plan_English_Feb2012.pdf



FCCC Jobs Board

Fingal CCC have updated their website to include an interactive Jobs Board. This Jobs Board will support early childcare providers to advertise their recruitment needs and to provide parents the opportunity to advertise needs with the aim of linking, early years, childminders, and parents in the Fingal area. The new FCCC Jobs Board facilitates the recruitment of staff into the ELC Sector in Fingal. To advertise a job simply go to our website and click on the jobs board tab. Employers with job vacancies can post a job by clicking on the link above and fill in the required fields. The jobs posted will go live immediately and will be visible on the site for 30 days and will then be archived. **Note - you don't need to set up a log in, just complete the form and click submit.**

Service Closures

We have been asked what the process is for services, if for whatever reason, you have decided not to reopen or closed within the current programme year. The steps are as follows:

- Inform FCCC via email to info@fingalcountychildcare.ie
- Complete the Cessation of Services form for Tusla click on the link below. <u>http://www.tusla.ie/uploads/content/Cessation_of_Service.pdf</u>
- Inform Pobal & make any necessary changes to registrations on the HIVE. Service Closure If an Approved Provider closes its ELC service, or ceases to provide a DCEDIY childcare programme, notice must be submitted in writing immediately to the local City/County Childcare Committee and the Data Management Team in the Scheme Administrator by raising a service request on the EY HIVE and selecting the Request Programme Type "User Account Management", then selecting the Category "How to" and the Sub-Category "Closures. FCCC will link in with individual services once the notification has been received.
